Media Lab project aims to study and strengthen the development of freedom of expression in Russia and to deepen the Russian expertise of Finnish journalists through multidisciplinary research and a strong outreach to society. The research analyzes state control mechanisms, their implementation, and the remaining free spaces of independent media.

DATA JOURNALISM IN MOBILE MEDIA LANDSCAPE – RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PROJECT (MODAJO)

The main purpose of this research and development project is to raise Finnish data journalism to international level. First section focuses on the new challenges of mobile data journalism. The second section concentrates on educational challenges of data journalism. The research and development project is a joint-venture between Department of Communication, University of Jyväskylä and Tampere University's Research Centre for Journalism, Media and Communication (COMET).

Terrorist attacks on the Charlie Hebdo journal in January 2015 activated symbolic warfare over attention related to political and religious values and feelings. The project studies the media event as a part of the changing operational environment of journalism and asks how the new practices between social media and mainstream media form or polarize different imagined communities. Method combines virtual ethnography with network analysis.

This research analyses racism accusations related to the Finns Party in 2010–2016. Similar cases and news reporting on those related to the UK Independence Party and Sweden Democrats are used as comparative material. The aim of this study is to establish the best practices for journalistic media regarding its challenges of reporting on racism, multiculturalism and ethnic minorities.

The project we will examine the ranking lists of peer-reviewed journals in communication studies based on their impact factors. It also compares the journals' impact factor listings to the Google Scholar hindex listings of communication journals and to the Finnish Publication Forum by The Federation of Finnish Learned Societies. The project also examines the quality of crowdsourced online conversations and the factors influencing the quality by analyzing empirical data.
